Project Description:

Restoration of the cultural heritage of Paskov Chateau – the Creative and Administrative center of the City of Paskov

The aim of the project is the restoration of the cultural heritage in the main chateau building, a cultural monument registered on the Central List of Cultural Monuments of the Czech Republic (No. 27983 / 8-692). A chateau of Renaissance origin with bastion fortification, rebuilt in Baroque and at the beginning of the 20th century in Novobaroque. It was served as a hospital in the 20th century. The permanent and seasonal exhibitions in are held in the chateau.

According to the Helsinki inspiration "Library as the Center of the Future", the goal is to create an open concept for education, meeting citizens and creative space: "The Creative Center of the City", where a library and an attractive exposition of mining past will be located and will be a meeting, education and creation space (classrooms, coworking space for workshops (i.e. music, dance, art, sewing, making - borrowing musical instruments, playing games etc.) with i.e. recording studio, 3D printer, creative workshop and shared space for meeting residents and sharing information (lectures, continuing education, University of the Third Age)).

In order to restore the second original function of the chateau, it is necessary to create a dignified administrative seat of the town hall (municipal offices, a wedding ceremonies' room, a conference room for meetings of citizens over topics of public interest etc.): "Administrative Center of the City".

Linking the two functions the project will restore a "Creative and Administrative Center of the City of Paskov".

We foresee the partner's focus with regard to the methodological and functional use of the library in search of an inspirational solution to the creative place.

The motto of this part of the project stands: "We designed the library so that we could respond to everything new. Even if we don't know what it will be."

Project Description:

Záky Chateau is the most endangered cultural monument in Central Bohemia. We have been working on saving it since 2016. The chateau currently has a new roof and a valid building permit to repair the building. We also have all permits to build a micro-brewery at the chateau premises . We have already brewed our own unpasteurized and unfiltered ceaft beer at the nearby brewery in Kutná Hora. Soon after the reconstruction the beer will be brewed at the chateau.

The microbrewery will bring meaningful use of the Zaky monument. There will also be a community center for the surrounding villages.

We are interested in partnering with microbreweries from Iceland, Norway and Liechtenstein. The aim of the partnership is to get from simple beer consumption to beer tasting nad cooking and to promote crafted beers. The partnership will focus on exchage of experience with cooking unfiltered beers, promotion, tasting and education. We would like to organize personal meetings with partners in our chateau where we will brew beers from our and also their ingredients and promote the beers. (for example, days of Icelandic beer in the Central Bohemian region). We believe that this cooperation will help to reduce alcohol consumption and to promote beer tasting as socially bonding experience.

Project Description:

Reconstruction of a folk history monument in Nemcice

We are a small rural municipality of Nemcice in East Bohemia, Czech Republic, close to the famous city of Litomyšl. We aim to create a good place to live for our inhabitants, to protect our culture historical monuments and traditional crafts for the next generations. In the co-operation with the local primary school we support practical education of children and young people in traditional ways. The municipality became the owner of a destroyed historical building that is suitable to be used for the traditional and practical education after its reconstruction. The building was bulit in 18th century as a roadside inn. It was bulit in a picturesque wooden folk architecture and it is registered as a Czech culture monument.

Our aim is to preserve the building and the traditional craft for the next generations. We have the project prepared for a very sensitive reconstruction protecting all the traditional issues – square inside yard, casing construction, mansard shingle roof, black kitchen, folk paintings on the inside ceiling putlogs. After reconstruction the building will be used for the Centre of traditional and practical education, where all the generations (escpecially children and youth) will be educated in traditional crafts, gardening a farming.

We look for partners especially from Norway and Lichtenstein who are interested in renovation of folk wooden buildings or in traditional education.

Reconstruction of the St. Havel's church in Kurivody

The Church of St. Havel was bulit in Kurivody (former Hühnerwasser) in the half of 13th century in the early gothic style. In 1279 the Church was mentioned in the historical documents as a place which the Queen Kunhuta visited to pray. At that time the Queen Kunhuta was prisoned with her little son – future King Wenceslas II – in the near Bezdez castle. In 17th century the Church was administrated by Lutherans and after 1624 by the catholic church again. At the beginning of the 18th century the baroque reconstruction inside the church proceeded and the church tower was added. After 1947 Kurivody became a part of Military district Ralsko and the church equipment was transported to other places around. Between 1968 – 1991 the locality was administrated by Russian Red Army and they established a vegetable store inside the church. The church is registered in the list of the cultural monuments of the Czech republick under the No. 32967/5-3488 and the Roman – Catholic Church is its owner. After the Russian army left the region, a new town was founded in the locality – Ralsko. Kurivody is the part of the new based town as its central part.

In the 90s the roof and the tower were repaired. The church closely co-operates with the municipality and they plan together the reconstruction of the church where unique gothic wall paintings from the last Přemyslid dynasty. They come from 13th century.

We look for partners who are interested in renovation of the Church buildings especially explorers and restaurators of historical paintings who could learn much during the reconstruction of the building and also could co-operate with the experts and bring new knowledge to our experts.

Project Description:

Activities in renovated chateau area in Zbenice

Lectures in the fields of vanishing crafts, produced by old masters in the field and lectures about restoration of such crafts. Practical demonstrations in the workshops with possibilities to try it.

This activity is designed for the wide range of people from children, students to seniors. We welcome collaboration with foreigners, already we have a number of confirmed arrangements with them and local subjects.

As we are located in the agriculture region the lectures will be about a historical farming, planting of historical types of wheats and other crops including hops, its processing and manufacturing final products such as pastry and beer.

All this can be realised and practically possible because we have a huge barn where we can set up such activities. With this production we can economically support the whole process. By solar roof system we ecologically lower the energetic level of this project.

Lectures will be also about a correct management with water and fish breeding hand in hand with ecology. Around the chateau will be restored a brook and also there are possibilities to restore some of the original unused ponds to reestablish the fish breeding. In our surroundings there are many underground streams with a high quality water. That's why in the old days a high class beer was made in the chateau.

This project is about a comeback to a healthy origins with the accent to quality, ecology with balanced economical structure. The whole project will be secured by a contract for at least 80years of such activities with the possibility of expansion of such activities. That's why I've established Association for restoration of historical monuments which is designed for such activities.

Project Description:

We are preparing the reconstruction of the baroque granary with the torso of renaissance fort this year. The fortness was rebuilt in the first half of the 18th century and extended to a granary on the basis of designs of Lichtenstein architect Tomáš Vojtěch Budil. This shape of the construction has been kept in its basis up to these days, although small corrections took place in the 19th century and at the beginning of the 20th century. The building served to agricultural purposes up to the 90s of the 20th century when it became a part of a village property after the dissolution of the agricultural cooperative.

The essential condition for requesting the grant is an international cooperation. We would like to reconstruct the object and use it for cultural and social needs of the village community, as a study – atelieur for students of the field of the historical sights reconstruction and would like to use it as an exhibition space as well.

Regarding to the character of the planned reconstruction and in connection to other historical buildings in the Czech republic, we would like to organise and regularly hold the "Summer school of the historical sights reconstruction" in the space of the object, aimed to smaller groups of students during which theorethical seminars and practical workshops in the field of exploratory architectural works will be organised. Students would acquire the basis of practical skills in technologies as plastering, masonry etc. The group of students should visit the interesting destinations in Plaňany surroundings and in the Czech republic – mainly Kolín, Kutná Hora, Praha, Český Krumlov, Lipnice nad Sázavou, Frýdlant, within the frame of 10 days cycle. They should observe the way of the historical reconstruction of the monuments in the destinations mentioned above, their specific constructions and their development towards the present days.

We would be really delighted if you are interested in the idea of our activities in the field of rescuing our architectonical heritage and if you would not mind recommending us eventual partners for the preparation of the action intended.

- interactive museum about way of life in the history
- Restoration of the castle itself will take place as a training event led by experts

Project Description:

Name of the project: St. Lucia – Historical Barracks Most

Investor: Bohemias s.r.o.

We run a family business dealing with reconstruction and renting out apartments in our town Most in the North-West of Czech Republic. Our town is in an industrial, coal mining part of Czech Republic, which is the main reason of a specific history of our town. Our newest project is renovating of one building belonging to old Austrian-Hungarian barracks area. This building is one of few historical buildings in our town, caused by destruction of old historical town (from 11th century). This is due to coal mining and then having to rebuild a new town for 70 000 people a few kilometres away (in 1970's) during communist era. There is also a big Roma community in our town and they are in a complicated position, because of prejudices in mind of the majority population.

People lost roots to places they knew, because everything was destroyed, now they still feel sentiment to old city, but they don't realise history cannot be changed and we have to deal with our future. During building new city, many sport grounds was built, but not so much cultural facilities. Renovation of this historical barracks will be a great compromise to help people to realise that we still have history and culture in our town. Therefore we hope we can bring a whole new layer of a city life to our town. We need to teach people that living in a city is not a "solo business", people need to interact and have social contact. Our project should be a place where many exhibitions, discussions, fairs etc. could take place.

Our building will be divided into two main parts, commercial and cultural. Commercial part should ensure economical sustainability of the whole project by renting out spaces (for example: restaurant, small grocery store, café etc.). In the second part, mostly attic part of the building, we plan to create a spacious multifunctional place, where events will take place. The cultural part will have an area of 986 m2

We would like to find a partner who could help us with the process of gentrification and creating community life in a city with a complicated social structure. Role of our partner should be to help with preparing quality events to be scheduled, to set a goal that is achievable and with marketing for them to reach the public. We would also like to host partner's creators, public persons etc. to share their knowledge about improving public space and cohabitation between people with different social, religious or nationality backgrounds.

PROJECT - RECONSTRUCTION OF MAIN CHURCH IN CHRUDIM

We are a roman-catholic parish in Chrudim serving believers from the town and urrounding villages with 34 000 inhabitants all together. There are about 1000 active believers – regular church goers. The main role of our church is the care of spiritual needs of our neighbours on one hand and the care of the buildings – mostly churches in our area. In the town itself there are 8 churches in a not very good shape.

Project idea is a **reconstruction of the main church of The Assumption of Virgin Mary** – the dominant of the whole town. We are in the process of the complete reconstruction of this church, roof has already been completed in several steps with the massive collections of money from the inhabitants of the town and financial support of the municipal authorities. The contemporary building project concerns the reconstruction and rescue of the towers, their structures, art –historical fragments, façade and roofs. The estimated budget is enormous for us and more over the project itself must be accomplished in relatively short time. The building project has been just accomplished counting with the sum of minimum 1500000 Euros. At the moment we are ready to call Norwegian Funds in the programme of The Revitalisation of Movable and Immovable Cultural Heritage. In the harmony with the main idea of the project we would like to invite the potential Norwegian partner to take part in the project studies.

We are looking for a partner who has certain experience with the same or similar problems of reconstructions and saving cultural heritage. Someone who is interested in exchanging relevant information, involved in the process of the reconstruction even as a remote partner. On the other hand we would like to open a long term partnership and cooperation.

Essentially, we would like our partner to support our claim at the Norwegian Funds, to be involved in the reconstructions from the very beginning of the work, to follow the steps of the process and more over to stay in the long term partnership with our parish. We are expecting some exchange visits of sharing our different cultural backgrounds and learning more about our nations.

In this moment we've received significant support from the municipal and regional authorities, as well as from the Bishopric of Hradec Králové.

Project Description:

It is a compact object with the area of 40,000 square metres. The Opálka castle is located in the centre of the plot, surrounded by a farm yard (a smithy, a distillery, a brewery, stables and several other bulidings).

The plan is to open the castle to the public, including education programs, Middle-Ages learning programs, conferences and historical crafts, a Middle-Aged smithy. In the summer, there can be different work camps or symposiums organized, including international children exchange programs.

Original crafts and other lost crafts (like coats of armour or sword production) shall be presented in the smithy.

In the distillery, the plan is to re-open the original production and the probuction presentations.

The brewery, including the original cellars, shall be rebuilt or reconstruced.

St Anne's Chapel (in the area as well) shall be open for public religious services.

A Jewish Education trail will connect the Opálka castle with the Jewish cemetery (the cemetery is more than 600 years old and it is one of the oldest Jewish cemeteries in the country) through a Jewish street of Strážov.

There will be goats, horses and sheep living in the castle area.

At the castle, there will be a Middle Age arena built for knight tournaments.

The forest park including the original grown decidous trees shall be renewed, as well as two original ponds (groundwater reservoir).

In the whole area, the using of any plastic shall be forbidden (life is possible even without plastic today).

Accommodation in yurts (old tents) will be available: as a presetnation of the way people lived before.

Which means preparing list of activities which can be realized there, for example: art sympoziums, art expositions, meetings and worskhops of students and young artists, history lectures, social innovations

What is the expected time frame for the whole process?

Probably we will apply for two projects : first for financing project documentation, engineering for building permit and second project for actual renovation of historic building of Katzelsdorf Jagdsalet

Project Description:

Diocese of České Budějovice and its projects

The diocese of Ceske Budejovice has an area of 12,500 km2, including all believers in this area. The territory is divided into 365 parishes and there are 545 churches and 252 parish buildings. This territory has great potential in the context of regional and international incoming tourism, which is based on cultural and historical attractiveness. According to its location, individual projects can benefit from the overall attractiveness of the South Bohemia region, which is interesting in itself and as well as part of touristic itineraries.

We would like to implement several projects within the framework of our long-term effort for the overall development of church tourism in this region. Intention of projects is to make the historical sites accessible to the general public, tourists and pilgrims. The projects will be implemented by individual parishes and spread throughout South Bohemia.

From our side, we would like to offer our partners possible cooperation in the field of tourism with the proposal of visiting our buildings and accommodation capacities and creating itinerary of a tour around the most interesting places in our diocese.

Partial projects:

Revitalization of the rectory building in Tabor, the second largest city of the diocese

A total revitalization of the building is expected, during which a multifunctional social space for meetings, lectures and social events will be created. An ecclesiastical museum will be built upstairs. By connecting the church and rectory building with the restored bridge, a very interesting guided tour will be realized.

Another project aims to **Revitalization of Provost's House in Jindřichův Hradec**

This project will open up this historic site to all, including people with reduced mobility. An integral part of the project is the construction of an interactive parish hall intended for meetings of parishioners, parents, children, citizens and interest groups of the parish and the city and for organizing cultural and social events. Directly from the hall will be the entrance to the newly modified courtyard terrace. On the ground floor there will be a barrier-free restroom.

Revitalization of the former monastery in Borovany

Part of the revitalization is the realization of repairs, the construction of a multifunctional hall for meetings of parishioners and citizens, an educational center for the public, and accommodation for pilgrims and visitors of the former monastery. Another part of project will be the creation of a museum that will be operated with the help of the city of Borovany.

Church of the Holy Trinity in Malšice

The uniqueness of this church lies in the paintings in the rustical Beuron style. The project assumes complete rescue and restoration of interior Beuron painting. Another output and benefit of this plan is also the establishment of close cooperation with Městys Malšice, during cultural and social events. An integral part of the project is the opening of the meditation area around the church.

The project of **General renewal of the Church of the Assumption of the Virgin Mary in Budislav** is also significant; making the area open for cooperation with a neighboring home for the elderly, for whom there would be permanent possibilities of mental and physical rest in the area of the church and its surroundings. The opening of the church for the general public will expand the offer of church tourism in the region.

Revitalization of the parish complex in Dražice, where the building and large parish gardens will be open to the public. The intention is to build an international mission center with accommodation. The project also includes a large modern multifunctional hall with facilities. There can also be weddings, social and cultural programs, meetings of citizens and parishioners. In this locality, this project will increase the accommodation capacity and expand the offer of church tourism.

Another project is the **Revitalization of the pilgrimage site with the Church of the Nativity of the blessed Virgin Mary in Strašín**. This place is part of the ViaNova pilgrimage route (European pilgrimage route). The intention is to restore the site of the pilgrimage and to create an information-educational circuit about its history, the history of the pilgrimage route and to document individual legends and other interesting facts about this site.

In the project of **Revitalization the vicarage in Netolice** we would like to establish a vicarious museum. The intention is also to create a vicarious depository of liturgical objects, books, furniture, etc. with the possibility of presenting separately as a museum of church history of the Prachatice vicarage and as well as part of the existing city tour within the City of Netolice including the Museum of JUDr. Otakar Kudrna, a significant native, politician and public figure.

Revitalization of the Church of the Nativity of the Virgin Mary in Vodňany

The aim of the project is to make the church accessible to the general public, to establish an interactive and virtual tour following the paintings by Mikoláš Aleš, to set up an exhibition aimed at connecting the church and the historical traditions of the region - especially fishing. The project includes a complete reconstruction of the church and restoration of paintings.

Project Description:

The Moravian Library manages several comprehensive monastic and church libraries, which were saved as independent units after 1946, respectively. 1950. These libraries had in the past different owners and fates, which not only conditioned the fund's composition but also its physical condition. Several of these libraries remained part of the library's historical fund after 1989, and some funds are managed by the library as depositories.

Almost all library units are electronically processed, but in some cases only by minimal records created by retroconversion of old ticket catalogues. These records would need to be fully extended to full-fledged records, especially in the area of physical description and provenance. This expanded description would then make it possible to identify in the collection other smaller historical library units that were referred to the libraries or at the time of the abolition of monasteries during the time of Emperor Joseph II. in the 1780s. Because each of the administered libraries was built by another monastic order, these funds allow for mutual comparison and mapping of trends in building library collections in individual monastic orders and houses, thus contributing to the knowledge of the development of book culture in individual orders. This knowledge can be very well presented in the form of modern technical means (virtual libraries, special maps). Last but not least, the various original holdings of library collections allow research into the physical preservation of works on paper, research on the acidity of collections (mostly acidity due to inappropriate location rather than acidity of the original paper carrier).

PROJECT – RECONSTRUCITON AND REVITALIZATION OF THE CULTURAL MONUMENT CASTLE LIPOVÁ NEAR ŠLUKNOV Applicant: VIA TEMPORA NOVA, z. s.

Place of implementation: Lipová 401, district Děčín, Ústí Region, Czech Republic

Applicant, the registered society Via Tempora Nova (Czech ID-Nr. 22826564) is a non-governmental, non-profit organisation, which was founded in 2009 and is the sole owner of the castle Lipová since 2011. Castle Lipová is an immovable cultural monument registered on the Central List of Cultural Monuments of the Czech Republic under no. 25843/5 and on the list of the most endangered cultural monuments in the Czech Republic. The purpose of the society is the rescue of the castle Lipová and is thus only performing activities to achieve such purpose. The society cooperates with a number of institutions and experts in the areas of cultural heritage and media and is being supported and subsidized by the Ústí Region, Czech Ministry of Culture, Ministry of Regional Development, the Environmental Ministry and various entities and individuals from private sector.

The society has at its disposal a complete project documentation for the reconstruction of the castle and a corresponding building permit. The castle was included in the Program for rescue of architectonical heritage of the Czech Republic in 2014. The society has successfully implemented in 2015 a project for the reconstruction of the castle park, for which the society received subsidies from the EU funds in the total amount of approx. CZK 25,000,000 (approx. EUR 1,000,000). The society is currently implementing a project for expansion of the castle park, which is subsidized by the Czech State Environmental Fund and EU funds.

The municipality Lipová, in which the castle is located, lies in the north of the Czech Republic near the border with Germany. The castle constitutes a local landscape dominant. The cultural monument castle Lipová is undoubtedly not only important from the regional perspective but also from whole country's cultural perspective with an important intercultural overlap to Germany (Sachsen area).

The society wishes to implement a project, result of which shall be the rescue, reconstruction and revitalization of the caste Lipová. The baroque castle was built in the middle of 18. century and is one of the largest and most important castles of similar nature in the Ústí Region. The castle is the sole secular piece of work of the architect Girolamo Costa.

The post-reconstruction use of the castle shall prefer public interests over private. The reconstructed castle and its park shall be open to public during the whole year and there shall be a priority use of the castle for castle tours and exhibitions, concerts and other cultural and educational projects. It is anticipated that these projects shall be closely connected with the donor country. The society is diligently keeping in mind the expected

post-reconstruction use of the castle and its park during the reconstruction itself. The castle shall be reconstructed while adhering to the essence of the original technologies and constructions.

Significant added value of the project is not only the "mere" rescue of a cultural monument but also its cultural benefit. The reconstruction project respects the rules of sustainable development and rules for rescue and recovery of the cultural heritage. The reconstructed castle and its park shall offer a place for social and other collective communication, place for individual and group relaxation and shall bring new business opportunities for one of the poorest regions in the Czech Republic.

The rescue of the castle consists of the its complete renewal, static security, recovery of the roof truss, facades and the interiors. The castle shall be presented in various educational projects as a significant cultural monument and there shall be various exhibits of various private and public collections both long-term and short-term. It is further anticipated that there shall be short-term exhibitions introducing various historical periods and Jewish and Roma heritage, which strongly resonates in the region.

The reconstruction and post-reconstruction project anticipates bilateral cooperation with a Norwegian partner not only in cultural but also in technological area. The heat supply for the castle should be secured by a heat pump, which may become a pilot project for other cultural monuments in the Czech Republic. It is very well known that Norway is one of the leaders in use of renewable energy sources and there is hope to find a suitable partner, which would have knowledge and skills required for such ambitious project.

The town of Zlutice - Reconstruction of the community site

Our city has prepared a study for a new exhibition of the Museum Zlutice. For the new exposition it is necessary to modify the premises (we have a building permit), then to produce and install the exposition (we cooperate with the artists - the authors of the exposition for a long time). The museum will present an important archaeological site on the Vladar table mountain (symbol of Zlutice), the medieval history of the town with a model of the town, visitors will learn about the Hussite past of the town, part of the exposition will be devoted to the displacement of the population after World War II (without any ambition to evaluate history) and the main part will be a browsing copy of the National Cultural Monument - Zluticky kancional - hymnbook from 1558 (original in the National Literature Museum, a full copy was produced in 2018 by the town). The new museum will also include an information centre and a small café. The area of the museum and information centre will serve the public as a meeting place (social hall for 50 persons), for tourists as a source of information about the history and present of the city, for citizens a place where it will be possible to settle a simple agenda (submission of applications, payment of fees, collection of documents, etc.). We will welcome as a partner anyone who is interested in helping to improve community life, make the fame of the small town more attractive and help connect the former German population with the Czechs, which has been settled after the WWII. We would prefer someone with experience in tourism in smaller settlements.

Project Description:

Archiv Atelieru Paul, association, is a non-profit organization, aiming to slow the process of deterioration of its archive, and to preserve it by relocation to a safe environment and by enabling the general public to access its treasures through systematic high-quality digitization.

The archive contains 107.762 negatives and photographs, made by photographers from the Paul family. The archive is logged within the CES system, and 45.000 negatives made by its founder, Alexandr Paul, are registered as Czech cultural heritage (no. 031-101415). The archive is an authentic and unique collection of photography, depicting Czechoslovakia from as early as 1930s – advertising, sport journalism, rise of the motoring industry, daily life in both cities and in the country, celebrities and important figures, the theatre; with a special focus on Prague and its Osvobozené divadlo. However, the main strength of the archive lies in the documentation of architecture and historical sites of Bohemia, Moravia and Slovakia, and of all forms of fine art, spanning thirteen centuries of Czech history.

The atelier itself (furnished in the 1930s in downtown Prague) was regrettably destroyed in the 1990s by corporate greed. Having lost the venue, the archive was moved to a temporary repository, where it resides for the last decade. Currently, the state of the archive is alarming – the original negatives are rapidly deteriorating due to acidity of the protective sleeves, glass negatives are susceptible to physical damage, and mainly, a large portion of negatives is highly flammable, endangering the whole collection.

Our aim is to continually digitize the archive, as we already have in smaller amounts by ourselves, to the point of having the entire archive accessible by both general public and specialists alike, while safely storing the precious historical negatives within the State Archive. We are thus looking for a partner well-versed in digitization, photography or preservation.

Reconstruction of former school, Šemíkovice no. 59, local part of the municipality of Rouchovany

The former school in Šemíkovice is an immovable cultural monument registered in the Central List of Cultural Monuments of the Czech Republic. The preservation of the former school in Šemíkovice is based primarily on a direct relationship with the significant personality of the poet Vítězslav Nezval. The poet's parents have worked and the poet himself has lived here since 1903 and he has spent several years of his childhood here. The school building represents a high-quality example of typical school architecture from the turn of the 19th and 20th centuries in the countryside and is dominated by authentic characters from the time of construction. The reconstruction project is designed to protect the existence of the physical original of the building substance and in case of irreversible damage seeks to complement it the way, which will be material, craft and expression comparable to the original, in order to maintain a credible and consistent presentation of historical architecture. The object will be saved by a complete roof repair, removal of moisture penetration into the supporting masonry, etc.

After a sensitive reconstruction and the addition of the necessary modern social background, the owner of the building, municipality of Rouchovany and especially the citizens of the local part of Šemíkovice, will gain a multifunctional building that will attract every citizen and visitor.

Intended use:

On the premises of the school municipality will establish a museum of teacher's life – a teacher's apartment, period interior, preserved historic toilets, tiled stove, original double glazed windows, plank floors. Another exhibition will be devoted to the history of the municipality and memorial of Jewish family lost during 2nd World War.

At the same time, the school building will become a place of citizen's meetings, meetings with seniors, public Internet, the municipal library and place to organize social events, including meetings of native citizens of Šemíkovice. The additional courtyard will be adapted for small cultural events; there will be a rest zone for the public and a playground.

Project Description:

Painted house, Karlovo nám. no. 53, Třebíč Reconstruction of the historical building

The Renaissance corner town house was built in the second half of the 16th century by the Italian merchant Francesco Calligardi, who has married and settled in Třebíč. With its exposition and impressive sgraffito decoration it has never had and to this day it has no equivalent in the city, which boasts many other important historical monuments. Due to its uniqueness, it is the natural destination of all visitors to the central Třebíč Charles Square.

The building is owned by town of Třebíč. After the basic reconstruction in 1987 it is used mainly in accordance with the needs of Třebíč citizens.

Renaissance ground floor spaces with vaults and columns are used for the fine art gallery and museum exposition. On the first floor there is a ceremonial hall with facilities. The attic spaces on the second floor were reconstructed into offices, warehouses and service areas.

The more efficient, modern and user-friendly use of the building is mainly prevented by the absence of barrier-free access to the inner ground floor and the absence of an elevator. For these reasons, the tourist information center had to be moved to other area. The long-term result of this step is the loss of visitors of the centre. The absence of a personal elevator makes radically more difficult the participation of handicapped citizens, especially wheelchair users, in civil ceremonies carried out on the first floor of the building. Another, but not the last major problem, complicating the use of the house is then the normal standard of inadequate social background.

Parts of the building are still unused architecturally and historically interesting cellar spaces and also unused yard tract – an atrium with valuable Renaissance arcade decoration.

The sensitive reconstruction of the extensive Renaissance historical building of the Painted House, which unequivocally respects all aspects of the conservation of historical buildings, would give Třebíč a unique multifunctional building, which would also suitably complement the city's heritage portfolio.

Project Description:

Chateau Nemilkov with courtyard surrounded by farm buildings

Nemilkov Chateau with courtyard with an old fountain and park is in south-west Bohemia. The complex is a cultural heritage sight and on the List of Endangered Cultural Historical Sights of the Czech Republic. The foundations are dating back to 10th century. The Chateau has been renovated many times throughout the centuries. The renaissance, baroque and classicism style is still visible throughout the Chateau. The whole complex is in a bad shape and needs complex renovation. Currently from the projects only the renovation of the roof is finished when the old asbestos was replaced with original wooden shingles.

The renovation's plans

The renovation of the chateau started in September 2016, when family Kaplan and Hager bought the complex. From the beginning the chateau has been opened to the public. The owners themselves tell people about the history of the chateau as well as about their new experiences at their new home and the plans for the renovations.

The biggest room of the chateau "The Dancing Hall" should soon serve as a place for cultural, social and commercial events and weddings. On the ground floor there should be small coffee place and at the attic place for exhibitions. The chateau's interior has many architectonical points of interests, which need renovations. For example, original Baroque wall paintings and decorations, wooden floors in shape of "Vienna cross", or alter with painted wall decorations. The work of renovators is also needed for the beautiful wall paintings of other manors, which the former owners owned.

The courtyard is surrounded by six farm buildings. The plan is to use these buildings as much as possible in the same way as they were used in the past. One building was a brewery, other was used for accommodation and administrative purposes. The plan is therefore to build a brewery, environment friendly accommodation and exhibition hall. Another building was a home of a gardener and coach driver. Br7lack kitchen and stove for making bread is still visible at this building. This part should be open to public for guided tours about the villager's and servant's lives and as a showroom for different old crafts. The door from the gardener's house lead to garden, which was famous for a tree nursery. This garden is not part of the chateau's complex right now. But it would be great to add it back to the complex and create a garden for the chateau's kitchens and gardening shop, which would sell old types of fruit trees as the former owners did in the past. In the next two farm buildings should be summer flats for rent. The last building should be used for wellness.

The river Ostružná (Site of Community Importance) runs below the chateau from south where currently illegal garbage dump is located. This area should serve as a park with natural ponds from rainwater. A new wastewater cleaning plant will be built for the whole

complex. Right now, there is a road along the river, which should be prolonged, so it connects Nemilkov and Velhartice.

Project Description:

The castle in the center of the village is its dominant and cultural monument of supraregional importance. The chateau complex consists of a single-wing building with a prismatic tower and a U-shaped farm building and is surrounded by a large park. In 1955-1994, after a major reconstruction of the interiors, the gynecological and obstetric department of the then OÚNZ Kroměříž functioned and over 20,000 children were born there. Since 1995, the chateau and the park have been owned by the municipality of Přílepy, and the management of the village is looking for a suitable but intensive use. At present, a civic association has been established, which is dedicated to intensive park renewal. There are also social and cultural events. Despite the fact that the municipality is able to keep the building in a conserved state, its current state is poor and characterized by a decaying facade, dilapidated windows and destroyed interiors. If no reconstruction is undertaken, this monument will be further degraded. Due to the failure of all efforts to find a suitable investor for a meaningful use of this area, due to the ownership of the municipality and due to the close relationship of the local community to this place, the use of the main chateau building for the project "Multifunctional Community Center Přílepy ".

This year, the municipality is preparing a reconstruction of the roof and ceiling in the first floor, where there is a wood-destroying sponge and for the next stages of reconstruction we are looking for a suitable partner to build a cultural social hall, community facilities, libraries and places for meeting citizens. The village also considers the use of the attic for the museum collection from the time of maternity hospital.

"Reconstruction of the 3rd floor of south-western wing of a castle in Bela pod Bezdezem"

It is one of the phases of total reconstruction of a castle in Bela pod Bezdezem, the castle is registered as an immovable cultural monument. The castle is a feudal residence originating in the Middle Ages with significant construction modifications from Renaissance, Mannerism and early Baroque. It underwent a number of construction modifications in the second half of the 20th century, which are inadequate from the point of view of historic monuments. A gradual reconstruction has been attempted since the 90's. At the moment there is a museum of Mlada Boleslav region, an information centre of the town with an exposition and a museum of Bezdez region in the reconstructed part. Cultural facilities with a library, exhibition and club spaces are also planned to be established here within the phases of reconstruction. next the

Reconstruction of Augusta's printing office in Litomyšl

The aim of the project is to save the declared cultural asset – the former Augusta's printing office in Litomyšl. This important historical and architectural monument and unique dominant of the Litomyšl city centre, near by the UNESCO Heritage Monument Litomyšl castle, has been abandoned and dilapidated for two decades. As a part of the presented project, reconstruction of the former printing office and its opening to the public as a newly constitutioned Julius Mařák Museum (a tribute to important Czech 19th century painter born in Litomyšl) is planned. In the spaces of the former printing office a fully equipped visual arts museum with year-round opening is to be created. An unique opportunity has arisen to create a museum and music academy in the house where renowned Czech composer Antonín Dvořák was born, in the village of Nelahozeves, 15 miles north of Prague.

The Lobkowicz family would like to transform the Dvořák's birth house, which is badly in need of attention, into a world-class non-profit museum. With thoughtful curating of historic objects and documents, combined with the latest in museum displays and technology, the exhibit would orchestrate a fascinating journey back to the time of Dvořák, exploring the early musical development of a genius. Education programs appealing to young people and diverse audiences would create lively ways to engage with the story of Dvořák and musical composition.

The Dvořák House Music Academy would attract young musicians from all over the world to the music training program, as well as to the atmospheric summer schools, master classes and courses. Sardice Residence

Augustinian residence, a place with more than 200 years of history, is a historic dominant of picturesque South Moravian village Sardice. Sardice Residence of Brno Augustinians at St. Thomas Church originated in the 1740's. The building is a historic monument and especially its stucco decoration created thanks to the historically first Augustinian abbot in Brno - Matthiase Pertscher after the year 1752 - is important. There are also several rooms in the residence - a chapel, a prelate cabinet and workroom, a big dining room and living rooms. There is sala terrena on the ground floor, connecting the garden with the hall, etc. An eminent Augustinian, scientist and explorer also stayed here - Gregor Johann Mendel, the founder of genetics.

During reconstruction in the last century a ceremony hall was established in the building where weddings and other festive events, eventually cultural events of the municipality, concerts and exhibitions took place. A museum with permanent exhibitions was established here besides other things.

The building currently needs reconstruction so that its historic value could be preserved and further used. Taking into consideration that the building disposes of big rooms, it offers a wide range of utilisation. Most social events of the municipality take place on the premises of municipal authority or local pub, which is not only inappropriate for the municipality and its visitors but also thanks to its unattractivity significantly limits the number of possible events in the municipality. It results in the local cultural life not being really rich although the municipality has a high potential considering its location and quantity of folklore event traditions. The conversion of the big room into representative hall would make it possible to not only move socially and culturally important events to appropriate and historic premises but it would also mean a chance to increase their number and raise their quality. Mainly cultural events, such as exhibitions, vernissages, folklore performances or wine degustations are planned.

Including the newly constructed exhibition about the life and work of J.G.Mendel who lived in the building, the whole residence would provide the visitor with a perspective on history of the place and connection to significant historical figures.

One of the main folklore events, except for the above-mentioned ones, is a Sardice folklore festival. This festival takes place at a nature site and organizers are in case of bad weather forced to cancel this significant event. Folklore is at the same time a connecting element not only for residents of the municipality itself but also for other municipalities in the region and is well attended. If the Augustinian residence is reconstructed, the event could be moved indoors in case of bad weather.

We would welcome a partner from a municipality similar to ours, which cares about traditions, folklore and community life in the village and would be interested in

partnership and cultural exchange. We would also accept a partner from the Church, considering the character of the building, or another partner from the area of preservation of cultural monuments and their use for community life in the municipality and region.

Budisov Castle

The castle is located on the north-eastern end of Budisov. Its history goes back to the 12th century with the oldest Roman part dating back to this period. The castle was rebuilt in Renaissance (in the 1570's) by Vaclav Berka z Dube. There emerged a block building of closed ground plan with right-angled triangle courtyard decorated with arcades. Current appearance of the castle was formed by distinctive conversion into opulent baroque residence of Paar earls in the 1720's. Except for botanical and anthropological collections; there is also a big part of zoological department collection fund, which is the only one of its type in the Czech Republic. The part of zoological depository accessible to the public represents the oldest collections of stuffed birds, mammals, fish and amphibians from department collection fund completed with trophies from hunting trips to Africa, Asia and Canada (involving thousands of displays).

The main goal of the project is to make the Budisov Castle, its premises and surrounding park accessible to local citizens as well as to general public.

Emphasis will be put on development and increase of the number of visitors of already organized cultural events, concerts, church and civil wedding ceremonies. Another goal is to extend the cooperation with Moravian Museum in Brno, which uses a part of its premises in the role of a tenant.

Specific outputs of the project:

- restoration of Salla terena (wedding ceremonies, concerts, lectures)
- specialist study rooms (zoological depository)

Revitalization of the Račice Chateau

The chateau Račice was built on the site of a former castle from 1275 - 1285. In the second half of the 16th century the manor was rebuilt into a Renaissance chateau. After 1620 there were several owners. In the 4th decade of the 19th century, the chateau was rebuilt in the Empire style by Baron Mundy.

In September 1938, under general mobilization, the chateau became the seat of the General Staff of the Czechoslovak Army for a short time. After World War II the castle was owned by the state. Until 2014, there was used as a boarding school. The next 3 years it was unused. Over the past seven decades, this cultural monument has only received architecturally insensitive functional fixtures and only basic maintenance of the building has been carried out.

Our company acquired the Chateau Račice in 2017. Already in the same year we have opened a part of the chateau area to the public and in part of the building we operate accommodation facilities for pedestrians and cyclists (we are involved in the Cyclists Welcome network).

For the preservation and sustainable operation of the chateau complex, its costly reconstruction and revitalization is necessary. We carry out all project preparation in coordination with the authorities of cultural heritage.

After the reconstruction, which will preserve the historic message of the castle, we intend to run a hotel in its premises. Above all, we want to make the entire castle area accessible to the public in its entirety. It will include conference- and seminar facilities. The tranquil wooded environment of the chateau grounds, covering an area of 55,000 m2, is ideal for educational programmes on the subject of sustainable development, such as the protection of historical heritage, the care of the landscape and the gentle interconnection of history with the present. It is a way to raise the awareness of the need to preserve historical heritage through a combination of education and leisure activities. Reconstruction of Riedl's Villa to a Social- Cultural Center (No. 120, Desná in Jizera Mountains)

In the years 1893-1894, a glass entrepreneur, and the so called "Glass King of the Jizera Mountains", Josef Riedel, has built a romantic historicizing villa on the site of a former glassmaking workshop. He has founded several glass and textile companies in the Jizera Mountains. Because of his solidity, the workers called him "the father of glassmakers." He also supported local social and cultural life, schools and the church.

The subject of the project is a reconstruction of Riedl's Villa (Cultural Monument - 12785 / 5-5598), which is a unique architectural work. Due to the absence of a real square in Desná, it can be understood as a "center" and the main dominant of the village. The aim of the project is to carry out building modifications of the building and its surroundings, so that it can be operated as a cultural and social center. The building adaptations will allow to create a meeting place of interest organizations with the aim of active use of leisure time, animation programs, social, cultural and educational actions (e.g. economic and financial literacy for the socially disadvantaged and those at risk of social exclusion). All these events lead us to the idea to establish the museum of Cpt. Robert Mc Caleb, which we would like to open next year 2020 at the occasion of the 80th anniversary of the liberty of Czechoslovakia as well as of our village from the occupati by the US Army. This way we would love to pay tribute to all, who were affected by the World War II in any way and who contributed to return the freedom and liberty in our home. We have a lot of material and artefacts for expositions including original documents, which we would like to maintain for next generations. In the museum, we would prepare also other expositions, such as activity of mentor and writer Ladislav Stehlík in Myslív primary school. All these expositions would be connected with many social events in Myslív.

For this intention, we have appropriate building in the areal of the old parish. It is well preserved building, which comply all requirements for the purpose of new museum. The builing is surrounded by large garden where could be projected the bigger artefcts but it could also serve as a place for relax. The main builing of the parish could be used for accomposition of the visitos.

Village Myslív was awarded by Zelená stuha in competition of Village of the year in 2000 and 2017. We are organising many social events such as Christmas concerts in the church, gastronomical exhibitions, games for kids as well as sport activities and we are keeping the traditional celebrations typical for our region during the whole year. Praskolesy

The "castle" in Praskolesy is a valuable historic building from the 17th century, the construction of which was completed in the 18th century. The chateau was mainly inhabited by Karlstejn deans. The renovation of the building enables its rehabilitation as a valuable historic site as well as its modern utilisation not only for the purposes of municipal authority but also for planned local museum (museum of Praskolesy village and Karlstejn deans), which will also serve as a cultural institution for locals, school youth and tourists.

Museum and archive utilisation of part of the building will not be in contradiction to administrative usage – on the contrary, they will complement each other (for example a visit of the main big hall on the first floor, primarily designated for lectures, seminars, weddings, welcoming of newborn babies and other municipal celebrations, will also be a part of museum tour and commentary).

Conversion of two lower big rounded rooms into rooms of main museum exposition is also planned (they will be equipped with hint "historic" furniture, display cabinets and bookcases) as well as conversion of historic rounded so-called "old kitchen" into a room for workshops (workshop seminars) for children (especially for children from local summer camp and for local youth) where it will be possible to for example try some cooking procedures from prehistoric times over the Middle Ages to modern history on classical stove of 19th/20th century. Moreover, demonstrations of work with flint, trilobite taxidermy, making of archaeological and historic subject imitations etc. will also take place here on a big table. Another workshop will be directly in the exhibition at demonstrations of typewriters (since typewriting is for modern children already something like a mystery of the past) and writing quills. Staircase and corridor walls will also be partially used for exposition purposes. A way of drink and food storage of the past will be demonstrated in a cellar dug into rock.

One computer designed among others also for museum purposes will also be placed in some room. An accessible information database for the history of the village will be installed on it (museum and archive sources, various documentation, photograph library, article and magazine archive and book catalogue, educational films, clips etc.).

Project Description:

Adaptation of the information center to the library and extension of the gallery, hall and outdoor space.

Location: The town of Velká Bystřice

Justification of the intention

The investor's intention is to adapt the second floor of the Infocentre to a public library moved from the primary school building. At the same time it is necessary to find a new location of the gallery located on the 2nd floor. During the hearing in March 2017 was told the idea of merging a new gallery with a chamber multipurpose hall with facilities connected to the exterior of the courtyard and the parkan castle. In this solution, it is possible to use parts of the preserved areas of the ruins to expand the exhibition space and regional exposition.

Description of building development

In spite of a very turbulent development and a number of reconstructions, the chateau in Velká Bystřice retained the essential features of its monumental value. These parts include a Renaissance prismatic tower with the rests of remnants of vaulted Renaissance spaces on the ground floor of the western parts and the following remnants of vaulted Renaissance and Classicist spaces on the ground floor in ruined condition. Former brewhouse and the western retaining wall was built in the 19th century.

The overall solution concept

The proposal of the overall solution is based on the investor's program from March 2017 and on the analysis of the state of part of the ruins, surrounding lands and links to west part. This solution is presented on bases of the analysis of the state and usability of the ruins and the fulfillment of the program. In the first phase, keep the eastern and southern parts of the ruins, it means the staircase with adjacent spaces and preserved arched spaces and backbone peripheral wall. Demolish the rest of the walls and vaults and use the masonry to complete the top parts of the preserved parts and add a new building (scheme 1 - green). In the second phase, a room with a background would be inserted into the created space and a mass solution would be created proportional to the space and program (scheme 2 - yellow and red). The mass solution is created by two prismatic masses connected with the remains of walls and stairs. Among these massive masses is a multi-purpose chamber - a gallery covered by Corten metal sheet with top

lighting and visors and exterior views. Massive prisms with leftover walls are used on the 2nd floor as public areas of roof terraces for refreshments and an external library reading room connected to the Infocentrum. The left and finished walls form a ground-floor system of closed and semi-closed spaces usable for exhibitions, relaxation and social activities.

Operational solutions

The operating solution is based on the content and the mass solution. The Infocentre premises with entrance from the courtyard and service on the 1st floor are maintained. A public library is accessible through the central staircase. The current exposition of folk costumes of Haná is expanded to exposure of rustic farmroom of Haná. The windows in historic locations are restored in the new exposition. The multipurpose hall - gallery with 80 seats with the view to atrium is accessible from the new exhibition through a glassed neck. The warehouse and preparation of the exhibitions are solved as maisonettes workshops on the lower floor and stores on the upper store. On the 2nd floor in the former Zet Gallery there is a public library with capacity 11,000 books. Library shelves are placed along the perimeter walls at full height of approx. 310cm, respecting the central atrium staircases and windows. The staircase in the historic trail leading to the northern and eastern terraces is restored in vaulted spaces part of the complex in the eastern part of the ruin. These terraces sare used for seasonal seating and occasional social events. Hall space and staircase are connected with the surrounding grassy areas with the possibility of descent to the level of the castle park. The space below the staircase is used as garden furniture store. Library shelves placed along the perimeter walls at full height of approx. 310cm respect the central atrium staircases and window openings. The room in the northern gable is also equipped with shelves and an exit to the outdoor reading terrace.

Architectural and material solutions

The architectural design is based on the mass concept. Both prismatic masses (north and south) are connected by a terrace and form a solid whole into which i inserted the lighter mass of the gallery hall. The whole is complemented by remnants of walls and spaces completing the exterior. The solid parts of the southern prism and the walls are made up with walled and treated ruins. The neoplasm of the northern prism repeats the mass southern prism using fractured stone and brick material from a vandalized ruin section. Stone material supports mass solution. During repairing of stony and mixed masonry and a new stony wall, the mortar will be spread with a spoon to the level of larger stones. This method of adjustment is based on the fact that Gothic and Renaissance stonework was originally plastered. The remnants of the existing plasters will be preserved. The horizontal surfaces of terraces and atriums are paved with boulder paving in combination with turfs. The hall is covered in the roof and vertical planks with Corten metal sheets. The windows in the fixed parts are not articulated, the walls make glazed steel grilles. The exterior adjustments consist in grassing loose areas in combination with pebble paving. The open area between the brewing house and the northern prism will be used for social events and the shields will be greened. The historical footprint of the extinct castle part will be restored. The retaining wall along the western border will be restored and slightly raised (by 60cm) and a new submitted stone staircase connecting the moat with the chateau park will be built. There will be used the quarry stone from the ruins. Architectural, material and material solutions are illustrated in the graphic section.

Project Description:

Reconstruction and rehabilitation of Chateau Hrušovany (Wine Region of Southern Moravia)

The chateau was built by Michael Adolf of Althann, a prominent noble family in Europe. Classicist chateau is listed cultural site at the National Heritage Institute. And unfortunately placed at the List of Threatened Historical Buildings of the Czech Republic, too. The chateaux is empty, with static problems and destroyed parts of interiors. To stop the destruction process the City of Hrušovany has supported during last 10 years the reconstruction from its own financial sources or from different grants.

Chateau has been a symbol of the town of Hrušovany nad Jevišovkou for 350 years. For almost three centuries, it was a cultural centre visited famous people like Max Dvořák – an important theoretic of the Vienna Art School and founder of monuments care in Central Europe. However, in the first half of the 20th century, the chateau was used for military purposes (military barracks). The historical value of the chateau is even increased by unique paintings on the walls which were created by Alfons Mucha – a famous Czech painter.

Reconstruction and revitalization have been crucial thing for local community. The local people founded Association for the Hrušovany castle, which tries to find the ways how to save the chateau and arranges meetings with local people and cultural events connected with the chateau (around the chateau). The chateau has a great potential to become a cultural center for the community and the seat of famous city Music and Art School.

We intend to renovate the following parts of the chateau using the Norwegian and EEA grants: the roof of the chateau, ceilings of the second floor and inner staircase. Fire and intrusion protection system shall be installed. This renovation would follow the renovation funded by Ministry of Regional Development. After these renovations, the chateau will be statically stable, secured and open to the public.

We look for partner in Norway at the level of "kommune" and co-operate on the transfer of experience and collaboration in community center and community building projects. Alternatively, we would like to welcome those interested in long-term cooperation with an organization as our city Music and Art School - which we plan to place in the castle among others. The methodological assistance in the field of fire protection would also be significant for us.

Project Description:

Jirasek Theater - Hronov

The building of Jirasek Theater is the pride of north-eastern town of Hronov. The name of the theater is not accidental because Hronov is Alois Jirasek's hometown. The plan to build a theatre house in Hronov came into existence after the celebrations of Alois Jirasek's 70th birthday (1921). It was built from the initiative of Collective for Construction of Jirasek Theater. The original project with a museum, library and reading room was prepared for free by Hronov man ing. arch. Jindrich Freiwald (1890-1945). On 26th August 1928 there was a celebration of laying of foundation stone with the participation of Alois Jirasek who while tapping on it said the following memorable words, inscribed in the front vestibule wall: "May this work be blessed…"

The reconstruction concerns the museum, the old part, the main hall, the technical facilities, the terraces, Jirasek's bed, the room for performers and the exterior of the object.

The subject of reconstruction in part of the museum would be the exchange of heating, air-conditioning, lighting and water hook-up. An important point of the reconstruction will also be an application of a new step-in layer on the floors.

In the old part a total reconstruction and conversion of former disco club into a jazz one is needed. Considering the construction of a new jazz club, it is necessary to provide acoustic insulation from the main theater scene. The acoustic insulation will enable parallel use of these two rooms.

The main and at the same time the biggest reconstruction is needed in the main hall. This hall is original and its equipment is not sufficient for a full experience. A design of new armchairs, a new step-in layer on floors in the main hall and renovation of current hall lighting is needed there. Joists and ceiling should also be reconstructed and walls need to be painted. An appropriate solution will be found for hanging of chandeliers in the main hall.

As far as technical facilities are considered, it will be necessary to acquire a new sound and light control of the stage. Scenic lighting is original and its renovation is also inevitable.

A cafe and back area for festivals and celebrations, such as for example Jiraskuv Hronov, is planned on the terrace. The subject of the reconstruction is also a surface improvement of the terrace including its surrounding facilities.

Jirasek's bed necessarily needs renovation. This renovation concerns a retractable wall, a small sanitary facility and the same bed on the opposite side.

The room for performers is in need of total renovation of the space and equipment.

An outside image of the building is its exterior. The building needs a restoration of current facade and renovation of window padding, renovation of door padding, renovation and mending of roof fanlights, mending of roof construction, connection of the object to outside strengthened surface and lift solution.

Almost a hundred years have passed since the construction, which has left its mark on the technical state of the building. The building, which is the main venue of Jiraskuv Hronov festival, is a place visited by several thousand people every year. The object reconstruction is thus more than welcome and, above all, needed.
